### How care is delivered locally

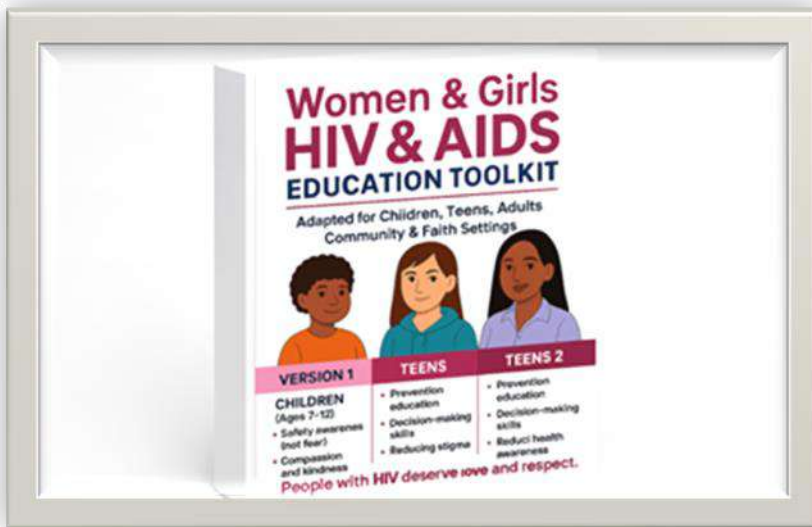
